
We look forward to seeing the children back on Monday 26th have a great week everyone.

Children late to school



The number of children arriving late for school every day still continues to be very high (approximately 20+ children every day).

Please remember that the school day starts now at 8.45 am (door/gate opens at 8.35am). Children will be missing the start of their learning if they are not in school at this time.

Frequent lateness adds up to a considerable amount of lost learning.

5 mins late every day = 3.4 days in a year 10mins late every day = 6.9 days in a year 15 mins late every day = 10.3 days in a year 20 mins late every day = 13.8 days in a year 30 mins late every day = 20.7 days in a year

In the final week of term, we made pancakes and had a very exciting visit from the Planetarium. We had great fun learning about our solar system and launching rockets. The children have worked very hard this term and we hope you all have a lovely break.

m 2271 Well what a busy half term we have had! At the beginning of the term we had our Year 1 open afternoons where we shared our phonics learning. At the end of the week it was World Religion Day. Each classroom had a focus on a different belief or religion and we were able to learn about how people worship and what they think, feel and believe. We even got to make and taste food related to specific religions such as Challah bread. The following week was 'International week' where we learnt about different countries and cultures. We tasted food, learnt dances, discovered interesting facts and so much more! On the Friday of that week we were able to travel around the world visiting all of the classes in school and seeing what everyone had been doing, we loved it! Last week was Children's Mental Health Week. Each day we focused on things to help us understand how and why we have certain feelings. We practised gratitude, breathing techniques and other strategies to help us understand and feel good about ourselves. We also had our Lego workshop! We learnt about animals and their environments and the importance of protecting our beautiful planet. We then made our own environments out of Lego including eco-friendly houses. Over the last few weeks we have continued to answer our enquiry question 'Is it our job to look after the environment?'. In particular we have focused on helping our friend Nicola find the penguins! In English we have written non-chronological reports about penguins which we will send to her they should help her in her quest! Next half term we will continue with our enquiry question, learn more about plants and how they grow. We will use the book 'The Storm Whale' to write our own finding story and also prepare for our end of Spring term production 'The Litter Muncher'. Mrs Fagg

Year 2

This has been a fantastic term for Year 2 so far! We have taken part in lots of themed days and weeks, covering topics across the curriculum. We loved World Religion Day, where we went round each class to learn about different religions. We also made a version of Jewish Challah Bread which was extremely tasty. Each Year 2 class also learnt lots about a different country during International Week. The classes found out about Brazil, Costa Rica and India. We did food tasting, created fact files and played some traditional games from these countries. We recently took part in Children's Mental Health week, with mindfulness activities, 'stop and drops' and reflections each day. All of these activities helped us think about our enquiry question 'What's so great about the world anyway?' and consider how different countries and religions celebrate life. We also made links to this in English, creating fact files about one of the world's most beautiful habitats, rainforests. We are looking forward to next half-term, where we will continue to unpick this enquiry question. In English we will be writing a losing story and in Maths will cover multiplication, division and measurement. We also have the music festival to look forward too, more information to follow about this.
