

Remote Learning Education Provision

Our remote learning provision will be under review and will be adapted as we continue to prepare a well-sequenced curriculum to ensure that knowledge and skills can continue to be built on so pupils can progress through the curriculum.

Following Government guidance Key Stage 1 children will be provided with approximately 3 hours a day worth of activities, slightly less for children in EYFS.

We understand that some pupils with SEND may not be able to access the remote learning without intense adult support so the SENCo will be in contact with these families to provide support and guidance.

Our Remote Education Plan will be applied when:-

- A full class (or bubble) is required to isolate.
- In the event of a partial closure.
- In the event of a lockdown when school attendance is restricted to critical worker children and vulnerable children only.

Provision

Learning will be uploaded to Google Classroom by 6.00 p.m. the evening before. The learning will consist of:-

EYFS

- Daily English Phonics/Reading/Writing.
- Daily Maths activities.
- Daily topic activity linked to different areas from Development Matters.

Key Stage 1

- Daily Reading/Writing.
- Daily Phonics.
- Daily Maths.
- Daily topic covering foundation subjects such as History, Science and R.E.
- Handwriting Three times a week.











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Marking of Work

The children's work that is submitted on Google Classroom will be acknowledged and marked. Teachers will give feedback and next steps when necessary. Children who are unable to submit work via Google Classroom will receive a weekly phone call from the teacher to chat about their work.

When school is closed for the majority of children a Google Meet will be offered on a daily basis with the class teacher (assuming they are not absent from work due to illness or self-isolating).

Parents who are unable to access the work on Google Classroom can request the work to be emailed to them. If they are unable to print work off at home, a paper pack can be requested from the school office.

Virtual individual sessions to children may be offered to specific children – for example, children on our catch up programme, pupil premium children and children with EHCPs.
