### Little Wandle – Letters and Sounds Revised

**Phonemes we have learnt this week in school –**





 <b>S</b>	<b>Pronunciation Phrase – s</b> Show your teeth and let the s hiss out <b>sssss</b>	 <b>a</b>	<b>Pronunciation Phrase – a</b> Open your mouth wide and make the <b>a</b> sound at the back of your mouth <b>aa</b>
 <b>t</b>	<b>Pronunciation Phrase – t</b> Open your lips; put the tip of your tongue behind your teeth and press <b>ttt</b>	 <b>p</b>	<b>Pronunciation Phrase – p</b> Bring your lips together, push them open and say <b>pp</b>

**Graphemes:** *If you want to practise writing our new sounds, follow the phrases below and write them in your yellow homework book:*

 <b>s s</b>	 <b>a a</b>	 <b>t t</b>	 <b>p p</b>
Under the snake's chin, slide down and round its tail.	Around the astronaut's helmet and down into space.	From the tiger's nose to its tail, then follow the stripe across the tiger.	Down the penguin's back, up and around its head.
